Entries close at 4:00 p.m., Saturday, June 28, 2008.
 Exhibits must be in place at 10:00 a.m., Saturday, July 26, 2008. All entries will be released at 2 p.m., Saturday August 2, 2008. All produce and Baked Goods will be judged Saturday, July 26, 2008. Judging will start at 12:30p.m and is closed.

Any exhibitor removing his exhibit before release time will not be permitted to make entries of any kind next year.

The entry fee is a \$17.00 season or membership exhibit ticket entitling holder to enter 15 items at no charge. A \$.25 fee will be charged for each additional item entered.

All competitors for premiums must be members of the Society or holders of season tickets except Preble County Junior Fair Members exhibiting only Junior Fair projects.

The Preble County Agricultural Society, Fairboard and Preble County Commissioners are not responsible for persons, items, equipment or accidents on grounds.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. All grains and fruits competing for a premium must be raised by exhibitor.
2. No duplicated entries permitted.
3. All vegetables must be fresh and clean.
4. Exhibits must be displayed on a paper plate, with the entry tag tied or taped on the plate.
5. Entries should be correctly named as to variety. The judge shall decide as to the eligibility of any entry in its class. Articles not classed correctly will receive no premium.
6. All fruit and vegetables will be judged on soundness, finish and uniformity.
7. Exhibits entered in the wrong class will be disqualified.
8. Best of Displays limited to 30" X 30" space.
9. Best of Show will be awarded in certain sections, within each department. They will not receive any added premiums money.
10. All competitors for premiums must be members of the Society or holders of exhibitor's tickets.

Class 2 - Hay

1. Exhibitors are limited to one entry per class for each farm owned or rented.
2. Show samples must be selected from this year's hay crop.
3. Entries should consist of 12 inches from bale of hay.
4. Exhibitors are responsible for making proper entries.
5. Exhibitor should have entry tag attached to item.
6. Insofar possible, U. S. Department of Agriculture hay standards will be used in judging.
7. Exhibitors must enter a class other than championship class to be eligible for championship classes.
